From the Heart of Your Shepherd

"For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures." I Corinthians 15:3-5

If I were to ask what the most important event in all of history was, how would you respond? I like to hope that every Christian would, without hesitation, tell me that it was the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. That is exactly what the Apostle Paul is telling us in I Corinthians 15. Paul says "For I delivered to you as of first importance..." Paul is telling us that the events that we observe during Holy Week are the most important events that have ever taken place in all of history.

We know why those events are so important. Jesus' death on the cross means that our sins have been paid for. We are free from the guilt and condemnation that our sins deserve. His resurrection from the dead gives us the assurance that death itself has been overcome. We have the confidence of knowing that because of Easter Sunday that death has been overcome. The grave will not hold us any more than it did Jesus.

There was another funeral during this Lenten Season. The words of I Corinthians 15 are heard as we lower the body of our fellow Christian into the ground. The promise of the resurrection is the hope that God gives to us at such times. It is at the death of a loved one that we are especially reminded of how important the events of Holy Week are for us.

What if I were to ask you what the most important thing was for you in your life? I imagine that different people would give a lot of different answers to that question. It is certainly true that God has blessed us far more than we could ever deserve, but the Apostle Paul gives us the answer to that question as well. He tells us that the death and resurrection of Jesus is the most important thing for us in our lives. It is Jesus' death and resurrection that gives us the assurance of life now and life eternal.

Knowing what it is the most important thing in your life also changes the way that you think and live. We live our lives differently than the world around us. Our focus is different. Our priorities are different. We live our lives in the joy and confidence of Christ's death and resurrection.

Sermon Texts and Titles

April 2 (Maundy Thursday): On Maundy Thursday, we journey with Jesus to the upper room. He gathers with His disciples as He institutes the Sacrament of Holy Communion. The sermon text will be Matthew 26:17-30. The title of the sermon will be "The Best Meal You've Ever Had." Jesus comes to us in the Sacrament of Holy Communion and gives us more than just food to sustain our bodies. He comes to us and gives us the very forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of faith.

April 3 (Good Friday): On Good Friday, we journey with Jesus to the cross. We will witness how our Lord lays down His life for our sins. He will take upon Himself the punishment that we deserve. The text for the sermon will be John 3:16. The title of the Sermon will be "For You." We see how all that our Lord does is done for us.

April 5: Easter Sunday is the highest festival in the church year. The text for the sermon will be I Corinthians 15:1-11. The title of the sermon will be "Of First Importance." The Apostle Paul reminds us that the resurrection of Jesus from the dead is the most important thing that has ever happened in the world. It is also the most important thing in our lives. His resurrection from the dead gives us the assurance that too shall rise.

April 9th & 12th: The sermon text for the 2nd Sunday of Easter will be our first reading from Acts 5:29-42. The title of the sermon will be "Worthy to Suffer." We see what happens following Jesus' resurrection from the dead. We see that the apostles are accused of filling the whole world with the message of Jesus' resurrection from the dead. The good news of Jesus' resurrection is something that God's people cannot keep to themselves.

April 16th & 19th: The sermon text for the 3rd Sunday of Easter will be the Gospel reading from Luke 24:13-35. The title of the sermon will be "The Resurrection Life." Our text takes place on the road to Emmaus. We see what life is like without the resurrection, but we also see what happens when people have the assurance of the resurrection.

April 23rd & 26th: The sermon text for the 4th Sunday of Easter will be from the Gospel reading, John 10:10. The title of the sermon will be "The Abundant Life." Jesus' resurrection from the dead gives us the abundant life.

Easter Monday: There is no school the day after Easter.

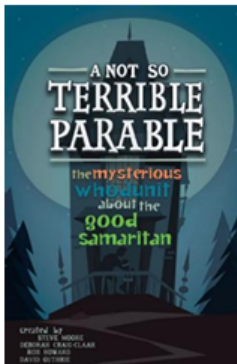

STEWARDSHIP NEWS AND VIEWS:

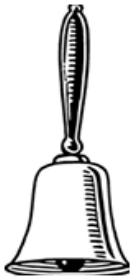
Steward leaders know that just as our Lord uses the creation to proclaim His handiwork (PSALM 24). He also gives us stewardship reminders in many places. Stewardship sermons and Bible Classes are where the Spirit teaches, and reminders of what the Spirit has taught us come from many other fascinating places. Our Lord has a wonderful way of using so many different things and people to lead us to engage the task for which we were made and redeemed: stewardship!

Many hold the faulty opinion that stewardship is all about hitting a target. It is about decisions, commitments, giving charts, percentages and paying the bills. All of these things may produce results in the local congregations to varying degrees. But they will inhibit the free and joyous activity of the children of God in managing life's resources for God's purposes.

But when we see stewardship as the free and joyous activity of the child of God, we start to swing freely. We see in Genesis that we were made for this task: the task of priestly care and concern for all that God has made. We use those good gifts for the benefit of his neighbor and for God's glory. When we fail in this task, like the first stewards Adam and Eve did in the Garden, the One who owns everything by virtue of creation restores us by His work of redemption in Jesus Christ. In this restoration, a major miracle happens. Our Lord puts us back in the position of steward over what we had attempted to idolatrously steal from Him in our sin. The ongoing stewardship with which we have been entrusted is His act of grace toward us and our worship toward Him!

Stewardship is ultimately about Jesus and His Gospel!

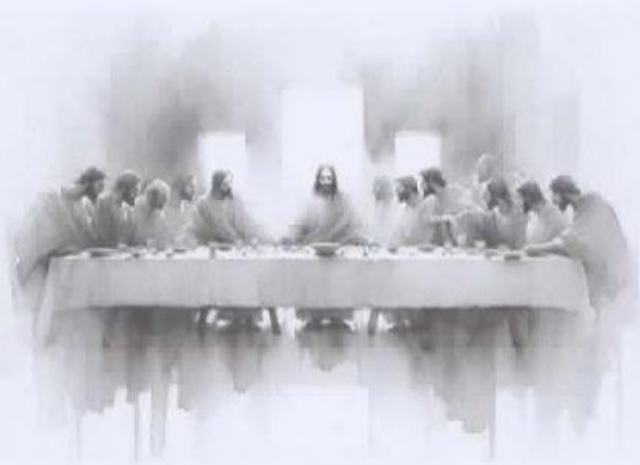

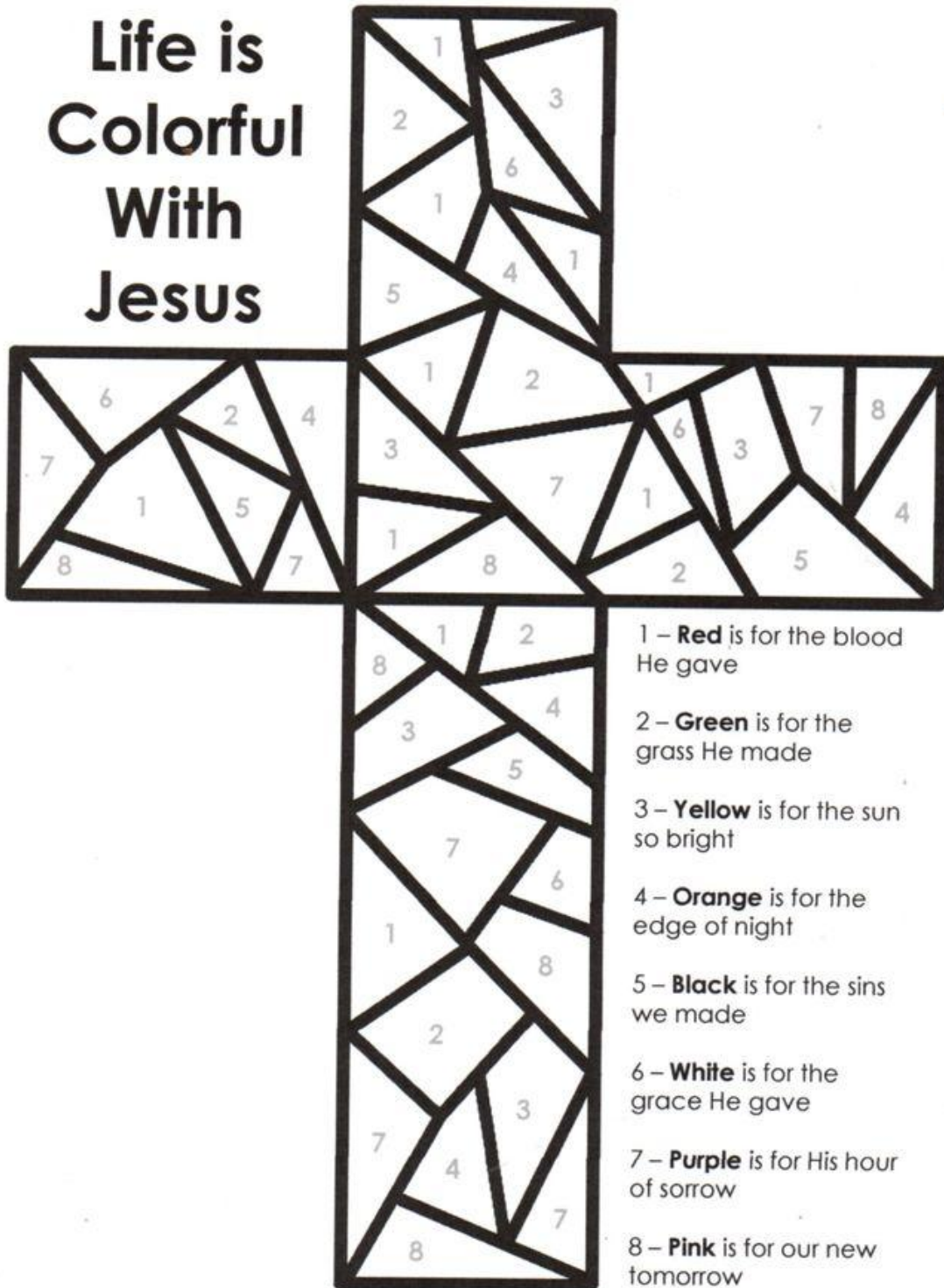
